Greetings from Singapore. My name is Ian Storey and I am a senior fellow at ISEAS. I'm also editor of the peer-review academic journal *Contemporary Southeast Asia*.

I write to you with a request that I hope you can help me with. We have received a submission to the journal entitled "Understanding Humanitarian Assistance and Sovereignty: The Case of Indonesia".

The abstract is as follows:

Southeast Asia has always been thought of as a region that strongly values its freedom from external "interference" in its domestic affairs and is relatively resistant to the influence from externally generated norms. Indonesia for instance, has been reluctant to be seen as a country dependent on external aid to cope with disasters, and issues. During the 2018 Sulawesi earthquake, Indonesian government again ordered foreign aid workers to pull out of the quake zone citing that the presence of foreign military personnel infringed its sovereignty. While Indonesia was initially resistant to external intervention, external factors such as media, the United Nations and ASEAN consultative norms gave rise to a change in the stance of Indonesian government. This reflects the shift in relations between ASEAN states indicating that even in the region where states are still committed to the traditional concept of sovereignty, external factors can play a part in influencing the situation.

Given your expertise in this area, I was wondering if you would be willing to review this paper and send us a short assessment and recommendation by the end of this month.

Abstract: Political pollsters have been evolving in not merely the Western, but also in the Asian democracies. A specific research focusing on the ways they took shape as liberal democratic epistemic communities in the Southeast Asian democracy has, however, been under-developed. This article is specified to examine transformations of Indonesian political pollsters as liberal democratic epistemic communities in Indonesian in the Soeharto (1966-1998) and post-Soeharto eras. Extractions of reports reported by these pollsters and mainstream media and the in-depth interview data derived from 7 political pollsters associated with prominent Indonesian political polling organisations reveal the following findings. In the Soeharto era, Indonesian political pollsters existed as fragile liberal democratic epistemic communities. As Soeharto regime collapsed, they increasingly played substantial roles in Indonesian electoral politics and gradually transformed from feeble disperse to robust convergent liberal democratic epistemic communities. In the post-Indonesia's 2004 presidential election, most of them turned into political consultants and engaged in a pollster war. These made them to taking shape as not merely divergent, but also vulnerable liberal democratic epistemic communities.
