Editor and Reviewer comments:

Reviewer #1: Methods: is right for this kind of a problem solving.

Results: are clear and significant

Interpretation: is good

Other comments: well written, consisted and structured. It would make your paper very good in reading if you would provide 1-2 graphic models explaining the relations between factors and results.

Also please provide your recommendations for the readers/users of your research, like students, faculty, politicians, media and so forth.

Reviewer #2: Methods: The method described is sufficient to understand the approach used in the discussion.

Results: The data presentation in the results is well organised and clearly understand. The Discussion supported with the latest previous studies.

Interpretation: acceptable and meet the criteria of scholarly studies.

Other comments: The introduction is too long. It would be better, if possible, to shorten the introduction and split it into two section; i) introduction which focus on the research question and research statement; and ii) literature review which highlight on the gap of study.

Other comments: The paper could be considered for publication, but some work still needs to be done:

1. The Introduction is not an introduction in the true sense of the word. It is too long, and contains material that should find a place in other sections of the paper.
2. The research problem is not clearly stated. A clear research question should be formulated and presented.
3. The paper lacks a Conceptual and Theoretical framework. Concepts are haphazardly defined all over the paper, and the theory comes to the fore in bits and pieces all over the article, even in the discussion of the findings. There is no systematic conceptual and theoretical framework. (Consider writing a brief Introduction to the paper, then explain the broad method that was followed in putting the paper together, then give the Conceptual and Theoretical Framework, then the Empirical Investigation based on that framework, then the findings, a discussion of the findings, recommendations and overall conclusion).
4. The paper requires language editing by a native English-speaking editor. Some sentences have been awkwardly constructed.
5. Careful proofreading reading required. A sentence here and there lacks an important word.

Reviewer #4: This study investigated the relationships between religious schema and tolerance toward alienated groups. It seems to deal with an important social topic in Indonesia, with practical implications.

Introduction

1. The social context in Indonesia is well described, supporting the needs for the study. The constructs are clearly described and the relevant previous studies are introduced.

2. One of the strengths of this study may be the inclusion of different university students. However, it is not clearly stated how these types of student groups are different. More information about "certain demographic makeup and curricular" may be useful to understand this factor.

3. Although the investigation of different university student groups was exploratory, it does not seem to be well connected to the main hypotheses. Wondering if this factor can be a predictor (university climate -> religious schemata -> tolerance toward minority groups) or a moderator (the moderating role on the relationship between religious schemata and tolerance).

Method

4. Participants were recruited from 7 universities and grouped into 4 groups. If authors used purposeful sampling, it may be further discussed. In particular, some information about the overall proportions of different types of universities in Indonesia may be useful to show how representative the sample of this study is.

5. The ground for the categorization presented in Table 1 (page 6) needs to be provided.

Discussion

6. The differential relationships of three dimension of religious schemata with tolerances toward two groups are well discussed.

7. The discussion about the differences by student groups (page 11 the paragraph starting with "The assumption about the minimal familiarity with alienated groups among the general population was implicitly supported by the result of mean difference testing in this study.") seems to imply that the authors assumed this factor would be the predictor of religious schemata. In this case, the authors may consider developing hypotheses that include all three factors (as briefly stated in the review No. 3)

8. When interpreting why certain university students showed greater or less tolerance, the authors focused on the different quality of social interactions (e.g., heterogeneous interaction) in these universities. However, it may be also possible that certain types of students choose particular types of universities. In other words, these differences in tolerance may be coming from individual differences rather than experiences in campus life.

Reviewer #5: This is an interesting study, well-written and information presented are significant with regards to the relation of religious schema and tolerance towards atheist and indigenous people in Indonesia. Literatures discussed in this study is sufficient to support results and discussion of the study. Methods are well deliberated. However examples of instruments could be discussed further in terms of its items and its relation to the study. In addition, conclusion stated in abstract is not highlighted in the conclusion section. There is not enough discussion on this matter either in the discussion part. Other than that, this paper has no major and technical issues and is recommended for publication in this journal with minor revision as suggested above.
