This paper investigates the impact of user's familarity of the health information on the search behaviour, and use the related pattern to evaluate the familarity of user on the searching topic, which sounds very interesting. But the model used is quite simple using language model, and the experimental design is also too simple to be convincing, for instance, with only 60 participants four different types of familiarity have to be evaluated, the authors should give a very despcription on how they set up the design, including their criteria of choosing those participants, etc. However, since this topic is very relavant to this conference, and worthy discussing, I suggest to accept if there is space available.

The paper is well written, but there are still some typos or grammatical mistakes.

- ---For example, in the abstract,..."investigates the impact of familiarity on the search behaviour by using language model approaach" should be "investigates the impact of the user's topic familiarity on.....";
- ----also in the abstract,..."The results showed that the familiarity affected health information behaviour" should be "The results showed that the familiarity affected health information search behaviour".
