CHAPTER IV

CONCLUSION

Based on the analysis, love according to Gabriel can be concluded as a feeling related with honesty, courage, respect, responsibility, compassion, and patience. However, his realization about this understanding does not come easily. At first, he considers that love can be obtained by waiting and submission. He thinks by waiting and submissive, he can show his respect toward Inez. He assumes those things are enough to prove his love to her. But then he realizes that what he has done is wrong and makes him separated from Inez. Finally, he understands that love should be free from any self-benefit. Love is about courage to sacrifice, to give-and-take each other.

From the analysis, Inez thinks love as something that can give her a comfort and secure feeling. Love has to be able to provide a convenient atmosphere for both and not about selfishness or taking the benefit for one self only. She consciously realizes that ambition and self-purposes within love can destroy the pureness of love itself. She believes that love can be actualized by the good cooperation of a couple. But Gabriel can not fulfill her expectations because her idea of love is different from Gabriel. As a result, she can not accept him to be her companion in life.

As explained above, the idea of love according to Gabriel is different from the idea of love according to Inez. This condition affects their relationship. Inez can not accept Gabriel's submission and silence because she does not feel secure in her relationship with Gabriel. By this reason, Inez chooses to go away and tries to forget their failures in the past even though she realizes that she indeed loves and admires Gabriel so much.

The failure of his relationship with Inez affects Gabriel's life. He regretfully cries of being lost Inez that way. Actually, he does not permit Inez go away. Broken hearted makes him suffer from the disease what is called senile dementia. He is not able to control his own mind so he often talks to himself as if Inez is really in front of him. He also experiences the unbalanced dialectics between the individual and external reality which is called wish fulfillment. As a result, he presents his wanted object through the memory imagination. In addition, the whole experiences change his point-of-view of love from waiting and submission become honesty, courage, respect, responsibility, compassion, and patience.
