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The Utilization Of The Repository Library In IAIN Tulungagung by Students Of College

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Abstract

The library is a place where it contains books from various collections that are arranged in such a way that they can be easily found again. Likewise the college library which contains collection books and various information related to the needs of the college library itself. Repository is a storage place that is set up so that it can be accessed through the internet easily. With current technological advancements, the college repository and library are interrelated. Because digital collections are getting more and more, the library also needs a storage area that can contain various digital collections. Thanks to this repository, of course, it can make college libraries easier to store collections in digital form with high capacity, so that collections can be accessed by students easily and wherever they are. But at present the utilization is also still not maximal in some universities such as in other libraries. This is caused because there are still some students who do not know the benefits of a repository in the college library.

Introduction

The development of information technology is becoming a technology that is always awaited by many people, both from adolescents to adults, information processing institutions both public and private. The increasing development of information technology also increasingly influences the development of information processing institutions. One information processing institution that is now very clear about the benefits of the development of information technology is the library, both regional libraries and college libraries. The library as a forum for all printed and non-printed information is required to always be able to provide various information desired by its users. Like university libraries that currently have a lot of development, from what used to still have collections in the form of printed collections, many libraries now have digital collections, such as journals, articles, and various scientific works from students, lecturers, and academics. The development of this information technology is also utilized by the library to store the collection of digits so that they can be accessed easily wherever they are, besides that the library can also save storage space.

The IAIN Tulungagung Library as one of the state university libraries also utilizes the development of this technology to store various digital collections owned by libraries. Currently the Tulungagung IAIN Library has a digital collection of 5024 collections consisting of Thesis,

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Thesis, Journal, Articles, Books and Monographs. The number of collections also needs to be processed so that they can be easily searched by users. Therefore, the library of IAIN Tulungagung keeps it in the collection in the repository. Repositories can mean warehouses so they can include libraries, museums, archives and even warehouses. Now the institutional repository (hereinafter abbreviated as IR) refers to the storage and preservation of digital information of an organization or knowledge assets of an organization (Branin, 2010, in Alb. Pramukti Narendra, 2014) in (Wiyarsih, 2015)

But to be able to access the repository is also needed a software (Software) in order to facilitate the retrieval system because the collections that are already a lot will be difficult to find if only using the manual method. At present many softwares are offered to various universities such as Dspace, GreenStone, Eprints and many more. The Tulungagung IAIN Library itself is to access the repositories that are owned using Eprints Software. Eprints is a digital library software developed by the University of Southampton, England United Kingdom. The first version of the Eprints was released to the public in 2000. Eprints have been integrated with extended metadata, advanced search for advanced information search, and other features. Eprints is an opensource-based library software, so it can be modified and adapted to local needs. (Wiyarsih, 2015) The reason the Tulungagung IAIN Library uses this Eprints software is because its features are easy to use and easily accessible so that students are expected to be able to use it easily. Because currently there are still many students who are less active in utilizing this repository service. This article was created to find out how students are interested in accessing collections in the repository.

Literature review

College Library

According to (Sjahrial-Pamuntjak, Ny. Rusina, 2000; 4-5) in (Betawi, 2012) the College Library is a supporting facility established to support the activities of the Academic Community, where the College is located. College libraries are libraries incorporated in higher education institutions, both in the form of university libraries, faculty libraries, academic libraries, and high school libraries.

In the College Library manual, it is stated that, the College Library is a supporting element of Higher Education in education, research and community service activities. In order to support the Tri Darma activities, the library is given several functions including; education function, information source, research support, recreation, publication, deposit and interpretation of information. Based on Government Regulations No.5 of 1980 concerning the principles of a university organization or institute, that the College Library is included in the Technical Services Unit (UPT), which is a technical support facility which is a complete set of universities or institutes in the field of education and teaching, research and community service (Yusuf , Pawit M., 1991; 102-103) in (Betawi, 2012)

Function of College Library

In principle, the main function of the college library is to support the Tri Dharma of Higher Education, namely education and teaching, research and community service. According to Sulistyo Basuki (1991: 107), The main functions of college libraries include: (1) educational functions, libraries help develop the potential of students with learning systems contained in the education curriculum, (2) information functions, libraries help students to obtain as much information as possible through information retrieval in the library , (3) supporting research activities, in this case the library provides a number of information needed so that the research process of lecturers,

students, and non-educative staff can be done based on data obtained from the library, (4) as a place of recreation or entertainment, students can rely library to reduce tension after learning tired with light reading material and comforting in the library.

Institutional Repository

Institutional repositories are a strategic step for universities to maintain their relevance to new information technology-based societies. As a digital library public space and institutional repository has enabled them to be visited by various members of the community, both from within and from outside the campus. Institutional repositories can be part of the university publishing and publishing system that is open to academics. The paradigm is an institutional repository as a "showcase" that can display all scientific works produced by academics. The repository is the first place for writers to display academic works and profiles that have an impact on their institutions, and throughout the world at large. Efforts to display works produced by institutions are actually a way to open access for outsiders to be able to use the work as part of scientific development. (Ulum & Setiawan, 2016)

There are several things that can make students access the repository more often, among others, namely the quality of the system owned by the library as according to Weber (1999: 859) the quality of a system can be measured through response time, turnaround time, system stability, ease of interaction with the system, the usefulness of the functions provided by the system, the ease of learning the system, the quality of documentation, and the ease of integration with other systems. In (For & Universities, n.d.) The next one is the development of collections by the library. According to Suharti (2017: 57) Collection is a term that is widely used in the library world to state what libraries should be held in the library. Previously the term book selection appeared, a book in a broader sense that included monographs, magazines, micro materials and other types of library materials. (For & University, n.) (University & Indonesia, n.d.)

Currently there are many university libraries that have utilized the repository to store digital collections owned by libraries. In addition to the many features that are easy to use in the repository, the repository can also make the library save a lot of storage for digital collections that are increasingly increasing. In addition, there are also many centers that have begun to develop collections that have been owned to increase so that the possibility of increasing access to repositories by students is increasing.

Method

The research method used is to use a quantitative method in the form of questionnaires made through the google form and addressed randomly to students about how students' interest in the library's digital collection and how the student's intensity in accessing the digital collection. Other research methods used also by conducting interviews with students. Besides this research also uses various journal references.

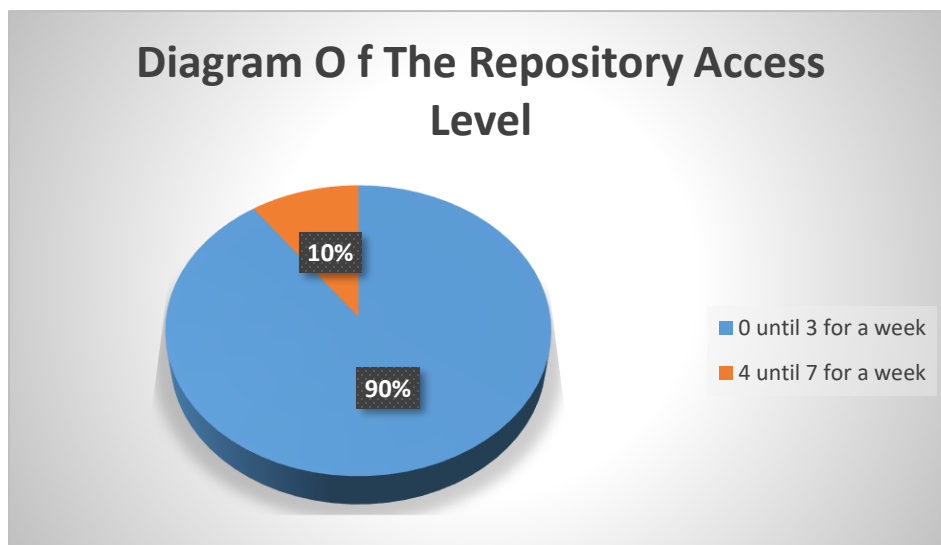
Results

As is well known that technological developments today have begun to enter the realm of libraries, one of which is in the form of the use of library repositories, as well as repositories in the IAIN Tulungagung center. The IAIN Tulungagung repository is one of the reference services being developed by the Iain Tulungagung library. This repository on other Tulungagung is still relatively new, because the other Tulungagung itself was officially renamed in 2013 ago. The digital collection that is owned by the library is also still spelled out slightly from other college libraries. The digital collection owned by the Tulungagung other center is still in the form of a thesis, a

thesis, several articles and journals. For this article collection are several articles written by several lecturers and academics. Likewise with the journals owned by the Tulungagung Iain library as well as writings from several lecturers and several submissions from other libraries. Whereas access to this repository is still considered less visited by students.

The results obtained based on the questionnaire given to students are as follows.

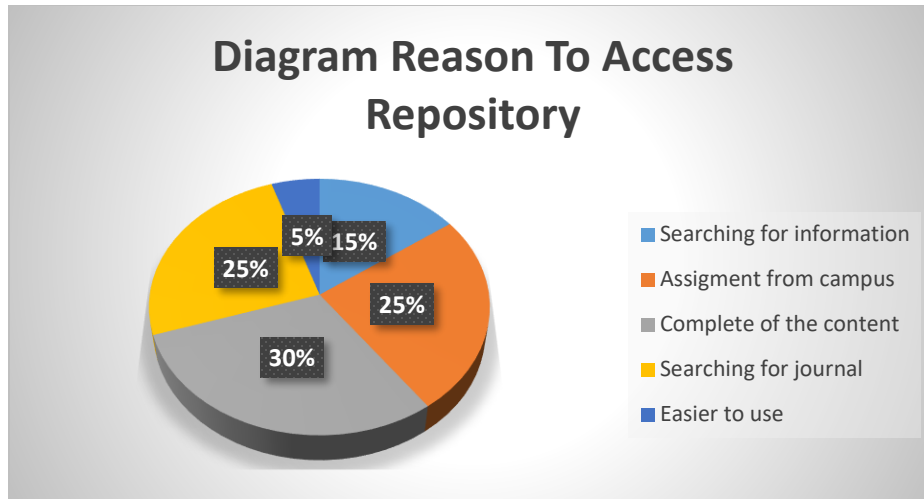
Table 1. How often do you access the IAIN Tulungagung Repository service?



Based on these results there are 18.90% or 18 students who access the repository on a scale of 0 to 3 times a week, and 10% or 2 students who access on a scale of 4 to 7 times a week. Based on the results of the questionnaire, the intensity of access to the repository that has been provided by the library is still lacking.

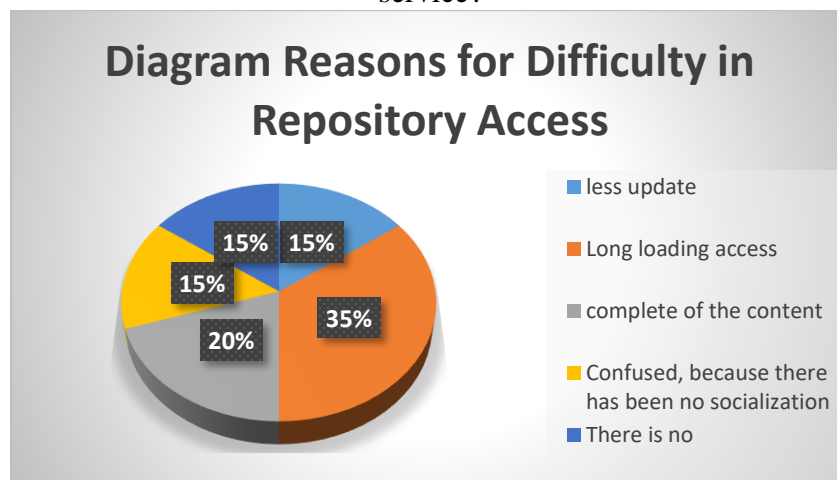
From the results of the study in the field, what I did was inversely proportional to the questionnaire filled by students. In reality, in the field the intensity of repository access is often said because students who come to the library to access this repository are final-year students who indeed need various references to complete the thesis.

Table 2. What is your reason for accessing the IAIN Tulungagung Repository service?



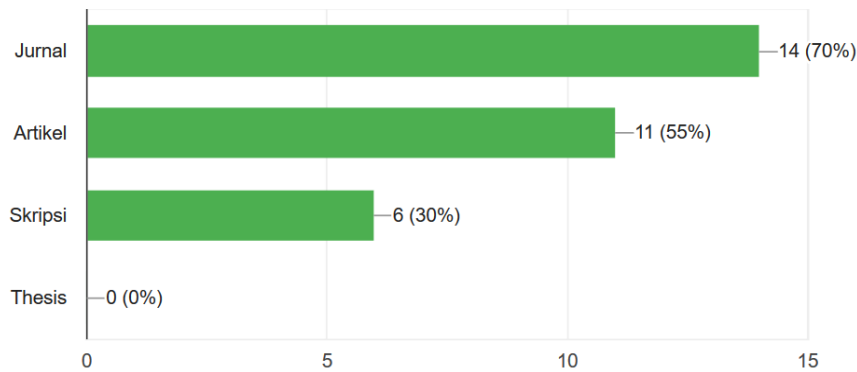
Based on the second question, there are many reasons students access the repository. The reason that is more often asked by students is to find references as much as 30% or 6 students. For reasons of assignments from campus and looking for journals get the same amount of 25% or 5 students. 15% of them wrote 3 reasons to find information and 5% or 1 student wrote reasons because they were easy to use.

Table 3. What difficulties do you experience when accessing the IAIN Tulungagung Repository service?



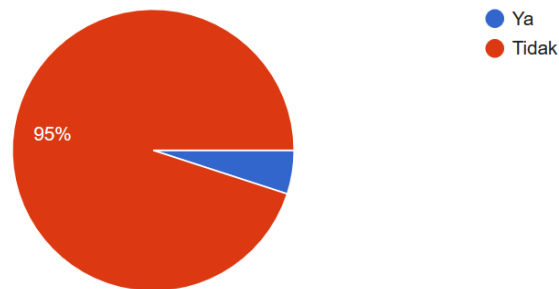
Based on the third question about what difficulties students face when accessing the Iain Tulungagung repository, there are some difficulties experienced by students with 35% or 7 students who experience a long loading process or commonly called slow. While some students experienced difficulties regarding lack of collection updates, confused because there was no socialization related to the repository and had not experienced difficulties with as many as 15% or 3 students. 4% or 20 other students experienced difficulties due to lack of complete content in the repository.

Table 4. What content do you access in the IAIN Tulungagung Repository



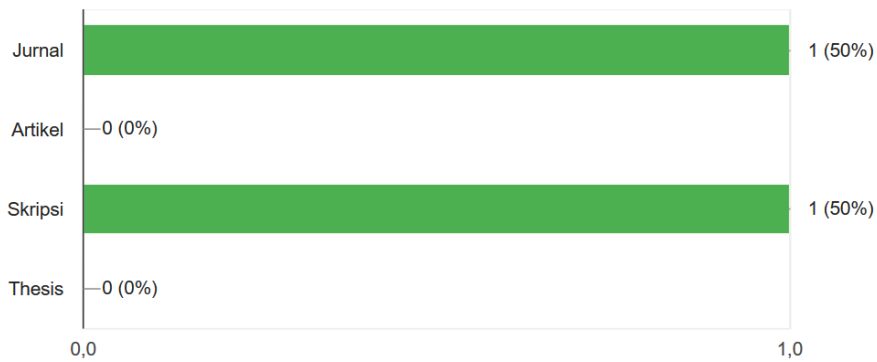
Based on the fourth question, collections that are more frequently accessed by students are journals and articles. There are 70% or 14 students choose a journal, 55% or 11 students choose an article, and 30% or 6 students choose a thesis. This shows that many students who need journals for their information needs both in completing tasks and just looking for information.

Table 5. Have you ever uploaded a file to the IAIN Tulungagung repository



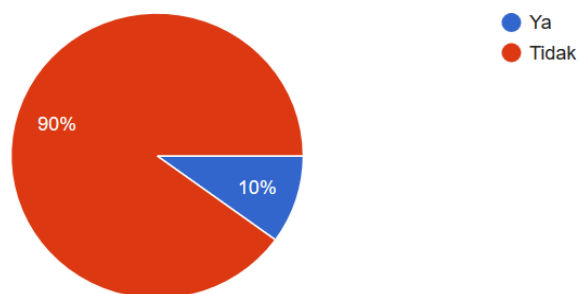
According to information from librarians, students and lecturers who want to upload files to the repository can directly upload them according to the procedures contained in the repository. but to publish the file it still has to go through librarians. And based on the results of the fifth question, 95% of students have never uploaded files to the repository, 5% of them have uploaded files to the repository.

Based on the results above, for files that have been uploaded by students in the repository itself are journals and theses. Because in the Iain Tulungagung regulation, students who have graduated must deposit a thesis in print and upload it in digital form into the Tulungagung Iain repository as a requirement to take a diploma.

Based on the last question, did students also access repositories other than Iain Tulingagung? The results obtained were 90% of students answered never and 10% of them answered yes.

While for the results of the students who answered yes, including the repository of Maliki Malang State Islamic University, UIN Sunan Kalijaga Yogyakarta, UIN Sunan Ampel Surabaya, and UIN Surakarta. Based on the results, IAIN Tulungagung students chose to access the repository provided by the library.

Conclusion

Based on the results of the questionnaire above, at this time many students who still do not know of the existence of a fund repository service benefit from the existence of a repository in a library. According to some students, the library itself is still lacking in conducting socialization to students about what is a repository and what is the use of this repository. To overcome this problem, the library is currently intensively promoting new students about the benefits of repository services when distributing library cards. Currently, this repository service has been accessed by students as a reference in finding resources for assignments given by lecturers. In addition, for the final semester students, this repository service is very useful to find resources to complete. In addition to the Tulungagung Iain repository, students also access other repositories from various Islamic Universities.

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
