## CHAPTER V

## CONCLUSION

The study of <u>Respected Sir</u> shows that the novel conveys a philosophy of life that is embodied in the main character's life course.

The conclusion of the analysis are :

- 1. The main character of this novel is a character that has a spesific views about man, life, and God. This views is build from his consciousness as a muslim that man is created by God to undergo His path to fulfill the duties of life. It is developed and enriched by his life experience during the struggle to reach his dream. These views become the standard of his value about life, people, and God--philosophy of life.
