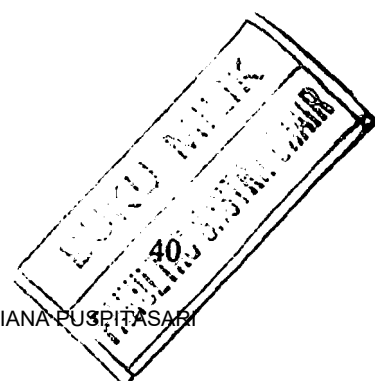


## CONCLUSION
