The next morning after Joanna gets up, Claire takes her to take peek the estates and introduces her to the neighbors. She feels weird, because she is different from the other women in Stepford. They are well dressed and full make up just for aerobic. They call it clairobic because Claire invented it.

In the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, the entire citizens in Stepford gather in a town square. 
Claire is also taking care of her attitude. We can see it in the way she talks and walks. The way she behaves in front of other people is also a way to show people that she has a good attitude.

She is an ambitious woman. She doesn't know who she is if she is not the smartest, best of the best and the most successful (scene 6, 00:31:19).


Although she is very busy, actually, she's still care and love about her husband. She knows her husband silly habit.

Joanna: "But I've always loved you so much. I... You know that" (scene 6, 00:30:37).



Bobbie: "What kids?"


Dave : "Our kids." (scene 5, 00:23:11)


Roger Bannister after he becomes a robot


### c. Setting of Place


#### 2. Joanna's House




Joanna house's security system




One of the wives takes out some money from her mouth

Bobbie: "To see if she was gonna die."


Roger: "So we could get the apartment."
