

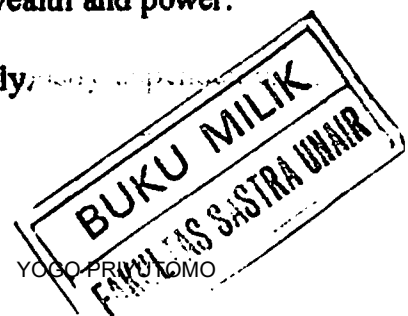
## CHAPTER IV
