SYNOPSIS

The Way Of The World is a play dealing with love which covered by intrigue in order to get intended purpose. The main character of the play is a charming young man, Mirabell who was apparently not a man of great wealth. He had an affair with Mrs. Fainall, the widowed daughter of Lady Wishfort. To protect her from scandal due to pregnancy, he arranged marriage for her to a man whom he feels to be of sufficiently good reputation but not a man of such virtue.
