

Abstract

This study is aimed to find out the conversational features, in this case invitation sequences, offer sequences and request sequences used by students in English Department Faculty of Humanities Airlangga University and investigate whether there are any choices in the ways of producing the sequences in the informal conversation situation. Through this study, the writer wants to compare the ways of producing invitations, offers and requests which are used in Javanese language (which done by students of English Department Faculty of Humanities Airlangga University) and English language (CA data). CHAPTER I
