CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION

The poem analysed in the previous chapter describes the situation of nature which gave some values for Wordsworth. The beauty of nature does not only influence his mind but also the poet's inner mind. He got inner happiness and quietness when he saw the nature. He felt a presence who must be thought by human being. It is the idea which be poured in LINES composed a few miles above Tintern Abbey.

To carry out the idea, it is important to know the poem itself. Here the writer will paraphrase the poem; analyse the language of poetry, which consists of diction (denotative and connotative), imagery (sense of sight, of hearing, and of feeling) and figurative language (personification, metaphor, simile, and hyperbole). From these analysis the writer will know the meaning of words in the poem.

These language of poetry, make the author had a deeper feeling to pour his idea. From the dictions, the author poured his idea that in a wildness, beauteous and greeness, he got inner quietness. Through the imageries, the readers have the experiences as what poet's. In this poem, the author used sense of sight (the beauty of nature) to show how the beautiful of nature, sense of

hearing which lead to the picture of a quiet situation ("inland murmur"), sense of feeling which make the author felt the quietnessas if he was in paradise. Here, he related it to the presence of God. He felt the joy in the city is only a moment, and the eternal happiness in the future, is the happiness in paradise because it is protected by God. The metaphors he used to compared the beauty of nature to the quietness of paradise. Beside the comparison, he compared the presence of nature to the presence of God.

Through the poem analysis and supported by the author's belief, the writer carries out Wordsworth's idea. Because Wordsworth was a Christian, it is important to know his principles about the goal of creating is only at God's existence.

Exactly the analysis focuses on the analysis of the Truth through Wordsworth's idea in the poem and the truth. In the poem Wordsworth poured his idea that after looking at the beauty of nature, he thought who create it, The Almighty God, of course. Since the object of Supreme truth is about the existence of God so the analysis of the truth through Wordsworth's idea about God's existence. The existence of God, here, depends on Islam doctrines as the reader's belief.
