SYNOPSIS

As the third novel of the Cormoran Strike series, the plot of *Career of Evil* still revolves around Cormoran Strike, the private detective and his working partner, Robin Ellacott. The story begins when Robin receives a package from a courier which contains a woman's severed right leg. The two partners then try hard to find the fake courier who is also supposed to be the killer of the woman. Strike himself knows four men who could be the suspects of the crime; they are Terrence "Digger" Malley who is a member of Harringay Crime Syndicate with a history of sending mutilated body parts, Donald Laing who is once a member of the highly prestigious army regiment but discharged and imprisoned for abusing his child and wife, Jeff Whittaker who is Strike's ex-stepfather and the primary suspect in Strike's mother's death, and Noel Brockbank who is a serial pedophile.

Throughout the story, it is revealed that the woman whose leg is sent to Robin is a teenager named Kelsey Platt. She is murdered and mutilated at her friend's flat when it is empty. The girl is suffering from body integrity identity disorder or BIID, a condition which makes her believe that one of her body parts is not supposed to be where it is and that she should get rid of it.

Kelsey herself is not the only victim, there are several other women who are murdered by the perpetrator including two prostitutes named Martina Rossi and Lila Monkton, a financial service worker named Heather Smart. All of those women except Lila are brutally murdered by being stabbed with a knife, and each of them has some body parts taken by the murderer as souvenirs. Lila herself manages to survive despite losing two fingers.
